1979

Tanya Tull, educator and social worker, creates the first social service agency for children on Skid Row - Para Los Niños.

1980s

PLN expands its services to include afterschool programs in more than a dozen downtown LA schools. PLN also launches family outreach programs that still exist today.

1990s

PLN wins the largest Family Preservation grant in the history of Los Angeles County to expand family outreach services and support more families.

2000s

PLN opens charter schools in Downtown Los Angeles and Westlake supporting working communities of the garment, toy, and piñata districts.

TODAY

PLN continues to serve L.A.'s most marginalized children and families through seven early education centers, three charter schools, and six student and community centers, serving over 10,000 children, youth, and families each year.

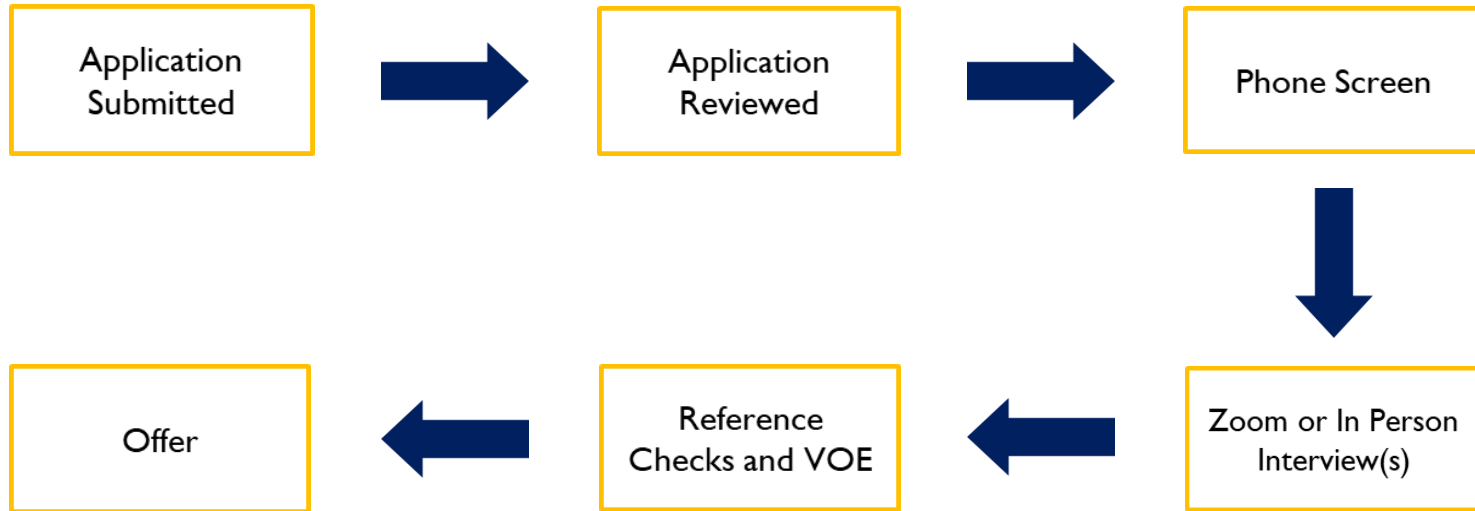

Application & Resume Tips

Application

- Research the organization.
- Upload Resume, Unofficial Transcripts, Licenses/Credentials/Permits.
- Include Two References.
- Recruiters will contact you via email.
- Prepare thoughtful questions for interviewers.

Resume

- Review the Job Description and align it to your experience/interests.
- Make sure your resume is updated and grammatically correct.
- If you're including a cover letter, tailor it to the job
- Include relevant experience to the role.
