



## Science Teacher

We are in search of an excellent Science teacher for 2018-19 to teach at the Humanitas Academy of Art and Technology (HAAT) on the Esteban Torres Community Schools complex in East LA. **This position is available to candidates who hold a Single Subject Science credential in any of the disciplines.**

The Humanitas Academy of Art and Technology is an LAUSD pilot school, founded in 2010. Pilot schools (though still LAUSD schools) have significant autonomy from the district in the areas of curriculum/instruction, governance, budget, and calendar/scheduling. This makes our school an exciting place to work - we are free from many of the constraints that make LAUSD challenging. Teachers work together to create their own curricular-based periodic assessments whose results drive instruction. The school is small (410 students total in grades 9-12), teacher-designed, and highly collaborative with many opportunities for teacher leadership. Humanitas interdisciplinary teaching is the driving instructional model and our students are heterogeneously grouped. We are committed to building a positive, inclusive community using Restorative Justice principles and practices. We run a full inclusion program, where special education teachers co-teach and collaborate with general education teachers in the instruction of all students, including students designated RSP and SDP.

The WASC Accreditation team described HAAT as “an innovative school...that models the best practices of 21st century teaching and learning.” Visual arts play a strong role in our school. Visit our website to see more <http://haateastla.org>. Our school provides take-home laptops for every student; we have a high level of technology integration in many of our classes.

The ideal science teacher will

- Collaborate with colleagues to develop and implement Next Generation Science Standards lessons that are differentiated to engage GATE students, special education students, and English language learners in a full inclusion program.
- Facilitate student learning through phenomenon based lessons, inquiry labs, and culturally relevant lessons to promote critical thinking, collaboration, and problem solving.
- Foster a classroom ecology conducive to learning, promoting respectful and caring student-student and student-teacher interactions using restorative justice practices
- Lead students to self-assess their own mastery of scientific concepts and skills using a growth mindset
- Enhance and support instruction by integrating various technology platforms, including the daily use of laptops
